Peace, Love and Hope. With a strong interest in international relations, Mary Lynne wishes to pursue the fields of diplomacy and Foreign Service in the future.





News about the Auditorium's Location

The Sacred Heart School of Montreal is proud to announce the location of its new auditorium. The school has undertaken a three-year \$5-million-dollar capital campaign, *The future at heart*, in order to raise funds for the building of this new auditorium, a wellness center and various other capital improvements. It is the largest fundraising initiative in the institution's history.

"The school's Board of Directors has decided to build the auditorium outside of the current building, and on school grounds," said Roberto Di Giorgio, Chairman of the Board of Directors.

This new auditorium design is anticipated to meet, first and foremost, the needs of 21st-century students. "Furthermore, the location for construction will have minimal impact on normal school operations and provide a larger and better configured space," said Shawn O'Donnell, Head of School.
