Urban Beekeeping Project

The School's Green Team, under the direction of Social Studies teacher **Ms. Alexandra Lantosh '06**, has been busy this past year with many initiatives, including the launching of a new urban beekeeping project.

Two years ago, the Secondary IV Environmental Coordinators at the time, **Lauren Gale '20** and **Sofia Scalia '20**, initiated a three-year project to bring urban beekeeping to Sacred Heart. With a strong desire to increase engagement and conversations about sustainability, the club with Ms. Lantosh's guidance, contacted a local urban beekeeping company to install honey bee hives on the School's rooftop.

Sienna Béliveau, an active member of the Green Team and incoming School President for the 2021-22 school year, recently reflected on the good news: "Since accepting accountability for the care of God's creation, and practicing effective stewardship of the earth's resources are part of our Sacred Heart goals, the Beehive project is a perfect fit! Now the hive is here, thanks to fundraising organized by the School's Green Team environmental club, and the support of donors through the City House Foundation. The bees are in a safe location on our downtown campus, and we can't help 'pollen' in love with them!" Fellow Environmental Coordinators Madeline Lily Christopoulos and Olivia Blizzard have also been hard at work sensitizing students to this project and are creating quite the "buzz".

Recently, Ms Lantosh and Beekeeper François-Guy from Alvéole, the urban beekeeping company that installed our beehive and cares for our honey bees, accompanied

Graduates obtain an internationally - recognized Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). This diploma allows students to apply to universities in Canada, the US and abroad.

All three streams will be taught using a blended learning model: a rich online curriculum in conjunction with scheduled physical classes, taught by Sacred Heart teachers who are designing instruction, learning activities, and providing quality feedback on all of their work.

The Field experience program, a unique aspect of our Grade 12, allows students to work in a field of interest such as:


