
A Caring and Inclusive Environment




Our Mission

Boarding at Sacred Heart

Sacred Heart has a long history of providing a warm, loving and caring environment for its boarding students. Our residence is located right in the heart of our school, with a full-time staff that lives on-site with the students. We offer the option of 5 or 7 day boarding to fit your needs.

Our boarding floor has:

- laundry facilities
- a common room that has a café-like feel where students gather to work together on projects and study
- a beautiful sunroom with a view of the city
- a fully stocked kitchen

The rooms are double occupancy. Each room is equipped with:

- single beds with underbed drawers for storage
- armoire
- a work space including a desk, lamps, ergonomic desk chair, and multi charger outlet.

Sacred Heart's boarding wing provides a unique opportunity for students from various cultures and communities to experience boarding life in the dynamic and multicultural city of Montreal. The residence has full-time supervision provided by our in-residence team.

Sacred Heart also provides after-school activities as well as social events on weekends, including art and cultural outings that take advantage of Montreal's vibrant city scene; trips to local events; sports; and much more.

How to Apply

1. Complete Application Online at www.sacredheart.qc.ca

2. Submit all required documents to admissions@sacredheart.qc.ca

- Birth certificate (including the names of the parents)
- A copy of report cards of the last two years
- A copy of the current report card, if available
- A small photo
- A \$50 application fee (domestic applicants) or \$250 (international applicants)
- A copy of the certificate of eligibility for English instruction (Quebec applicants only)

International Applicants ONLY, please also submit the following:

- A certified English translation of the applicant's birth certificate
- A copy of the student's and the parents' passports
- A letter of recommendation
- Any TOEFL, ILETS, or any other standardized English test results (only required for Grade 10 and above)
- Entrance Tests (English and Math)

3. Student interview (virtual or in-person)
